The City of Peterborough Smoke Control (No. 4) Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Peterborough of the Town Hall, Peterborough, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, on the 11th day of August 1976 made an Order entitled The City of Peterborough Smoke Control (No. 4) Order 1976, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of subsection (4) of section 11 of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within this smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty Pounds (£20) unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Peterborough (Room 145), between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays during the period of 6 weeks from the 20th August 1976.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 3EB, object to the confirmation of the Order.
