##### *The County of Devon (Mill Street, Sidmouth) (Width Restriction) Order 1976*

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When this Order comes into force you will not be allowed to drive any motor vehicle (including any trailer) of a width exceeding 6 feet 6 inches inclusive of any load in that length of Mill Street which extends from its junction with High Street, Sidmouth.
