NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Thurrock Borough Council (Footpath 49, Stanford-le-Hope) (Part) Public Path Diversion Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on 9th August 1976 the Thurrock Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point immediately to the east of the railway embankment north of Thames Haven Junction, in a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 76 yards, to a line running from the aforementioned point immediately to the east of the railway embankment north of Thames Haven Junction in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 30 yards and then in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 42 yards to rejoin the existing footpath.

This Order becomes operative as from 9th August 1976 but if any person is aggrieved by the Order and desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under Schedule 6 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 20th August 1976 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Borough of Torbay (Higher Brixham) Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Torbay Borough Council has designated the area surrounding Milton Street/Horsepool Street/Drew Street/Burton Street, Brixham as a conservation area under the provisions of the above Acts, which area is more fully described in the Schedule to this notice.

The effect of designation is that special attention will be paid by the Council to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area concerned. Future development and advertising in the conservation area will be subject to strict planning controls designed to secure the preservation of the character and general improvement of the area.

Subject to certain exceptions, therefore, demolition of buildings or any part of a building within the conservation area will now require the approval of the Council as Local Planning Authority.

Copies of a plan showing the area concerned may be inspected at the office of the Borough Planning Officer, Tor Hill House, Castle Circus, Torquay during normal office hours.

SCHEDULE

The Higher Brixham Conservation Area is an irregularly shaped area of approximately 48 acres of land covering the older part of Higher Brixham. It is approximately 1 mile in length and varies in width from 40 yards to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile. It runs roughly in a N.E./S.W. alignment from Great Gate in the N.E. to a point just short of Packhall Lane in the S.W. and includes properties in Milton Street, Summer

Lane, Horsepool Street, Bakers Hill, Drew Street, Castor Road, Knick Knack Lane, Burton Street, Doctors Road and Dashpers.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

Yeovil (Footpath Y.16/7 at Martock) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 9th August 1976 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Yeovil District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of a footpath at Martock which runs from a point which is approximately 80 metres in a north-north-westerly direction from the end of Church Lane for approximately 64 metres in a north-north-westerly direction, to a line running from a point which is approximately 80 metres in a north-north-westerly direction from the end of Church Lane, for approximately 55 metres in a west-north-westerly direction and then for a distance of approximately 40 metres in a north-north-easterly direction rejoining the existing footpath.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at:

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Yeovil District Council, 91 Preston Road, Yeovil, Somerset, BA20 2DP, not later than 20th September 1976 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Yeovil District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
