Notice is hereby given that on the 19th August 1976, the Council of the Borough of Northampton under agency arrangements with Northamptonshire County Council made the above-named Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, to become operative on 20th August 1976.

The effect of the Order will be to permit parking in the lay-by on the south-western side of Welford Road (between Redland Drive and North Western Avenue) between 06.00 hours and 22.00 hours.

# Northampton Borough Council (Countess Road Locality) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 18th August 1976, the Council of the Borough of Northampton under agency arrangements with Northamptonshire County Council made the above-named Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, to become operative on 18th August, 1976.

August, 1976. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time on the lengths of road contained in the Schedule.

#### SCHEDULE

# No Waiting at any time

- (a) Countess Road, south-west side, from a point 45 feet north-west of Monmouth Road extending for 200 feet south-eastwards;
- (b) Countess Road, south-west side, from a point 35 feet north-west of Lyttleton Road extending for 110 feet south-eastwards;
- (c) Lyttleton Road, both sides, from Countess Road extending 35 feet south-westwards;
- (d) Countess Road, north-east side, from a point 45 feet north-west of Monmouth Road extending 500 feet south-eastwards;
- (e) Monmouth Road, both sides, from Countess Road extending 35 feet north-eastwards.

Exceptions are made for vehicles including local authority vehicles, fire engines, ambulances and police cars, acting in pursuance of statutory duties and powers; vehicles whose presence is permitted by a police officer in uniform; vehicles used in connection with weddings, funerals, building operations and demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, road maintenance, the alteration etc., or repair of any main, sewer or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telegraphic line and disabled persons' vehicles. Exceptions are also made to permit a person to board or alight from a vehicle and to enable loading and unloading.
