Notice is therefore given that in order to maintain an adequate supply of water the Authority is applying to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order pursuant to section 1 of the Drought Act, 1976, to enable it for the period of the present emergency and for a period, in any case not exceeding 6 months, to reduce the statutory compensation release from Stithians Reservoir into the River Kennall from 2.7 t.c.m. (0.6 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours as required by Licence to Abstract Water No. 15/48/22/S/23 to 1.4 t.c.m. (0.3 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours.

Notice of Application for Emergency Order relating to the removal of the Statutory Compensation Release Requirement from Siblyback Reservoir into the River Fowey and to a reduction of the aggregate flow requirement above the Restormel Intake on the River Fowey.

Whereas in view of an exceptional shortage of rain, a serious deficiency of supplies is threatened in the area of the South West Water Authority which is served from the Siblyback Reservoir in the Parish of St. Cleer in the Caradon District.

Notice is therefore given that in order to maintain an adequate supply of water the Authority is applying to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order pursuant to section 1 of the Drought Act, 1976, to enable it for the period of the present emergency and for a period, in any case, not exceeding six months, to remove the statutory compensation requirement of 3.1 t.c.m. (0.68 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours from Siblyback Reservoir into the River Fowey as required by Licences No. 15/48/18/S/32 and 15/47/141/S/26 and also to reduce the aggregate flow requirement above the Restormel Intake at National Grid Reference SX096 625 from 98.56 t.c.m. (21.68 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours as required by Licence No. 15/48/18/S/28 to 18.64 t.c.m. (4.10 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours.

RIBBLE DIVISION

DROUGHT ACT 1976

Proposed Prohibition and Limitations on the Use of Water Notice is hereby given that the North West Water Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") have applied to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order under Section 1 (3) (b) of the Drought Act 1976 (hereinafter called "the Act") authorising the Authority:

- (1) To prohibit or limit for such period not exceeding 6 months as may be specified in the Order throughout the Ribble Division water supply area of the Authority the use of water for the following purposes (being purposes specified in the Drought Direction 1978 duly made by the Secretary of State under section 1 (3) (b) of the Act):

(a) The watering, by hosepipe, sprinkler, or other apparatus, of parks, ornamental gardens, lawns, recreation grounds, sports grounds, playing fields, golf courses or racecourses, whether publicly or privately owned;

(b) the filling, whether wholly or partially, of privately owned swimming pools and ornamental ponds other than fish ponds;

(c) the operation of mechanical car washers, whether automatic or not;

(d) the washing of road vehicles for any reason other than safety or hygiene;

(e) the cleaning of the exterior of buildings;

(f) the operation of ornamental fountains or cascades including any where water is recycled;

(g) the operation, in relation to any building or other premises, of any cistern which flushes automatically during any period when the premises are wholly or substantially unoccupied.

- (2) Authorising any officer of the Authority on producing if required some duly authenticated document showing his authority to enter at all reasonable hours any premises to which a prohibition or limitation for the time being in force under the Order applies for the purpose of ascertaining whether there is or has been any contravention of the prohibition or limitation.

For the purposes of this notice the Ribble Division water supply area means the area shown coloured red on the map of the Authority prepared for the purposes of the proposed Order comprising part of the county of Lancashire namely, the whole of the districts of Blackpool, Chorley, Fylde, Hyndburn, Preston, South Ribble and Wyre and parts of the districts of Blackburn, Burnley, Pendle and Ribble Valley.
