*The Stockport Metropolitan Borough (Footpath No. 62 Bradshaw Hall Estate—No. 1), Public Path Diversion Order 1976.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order hereinafter referred to as "the Order" made on the 20th August 1976, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 62 Bradshaw Hall Estate, Cheadle Hulme, Stockport, which commences at a point approximately 43 metres west of Westfield Road and runs in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 182 metres and to provide an alternative highway which is all that footpath which commences at a point on Southdown Crescent approximately 30 metres west of its junction with Westfield Road and which runs for approximately 260 metres in a north-westerly and then northerly direction.

*The Vale Royal District Council (Footpath No. 24, Cuddington) Public Path Diversion Order 1976*

Notice is hereby given that on 16th August 1976, the Vale Royal District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert a section of the public right of way numbered 24 on the definitive map for the Cuddington area of the Vale Royal District, prepared under the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 (Part IV) which extends from point A eastwards from the A49 for a distance of approximately 135 metres to point B. The alternative route from point A follows the eastern side of the A49 to its junction with Glebe Road (approximately 135 metres). Eastwards along Glebe Road to its junction with Mayfield Drive (approx-

mately 115 metres) and northwards for approximately 38 metres and then eastwards once more along Moorlands Avenue for approximately 85 metres. From this point the footpath continues eastward for a distance of 98 metres to the point marked B on the plan.
