*Conservation Area—Symondsburry*

GREENWICH LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

*Variation of Blackheath Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich by resolution dated 8th July 1976 and in accordance with section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 made a variation to the Black-

heath Conservation Area by excluding the area described below. This area together with other land is to form a separate Conservation Area known as the Liskeard Gardens Conservation Area.

*Description of boundaries of land to be excluded*

Beginning at a point made by the converging of the lines down the middle of Kidbrooke Gardens and Liskeard Gardens. Following from that point along the mid-line of Liskeard Gardens in a northerly direction and turning east as the road turns to a point in alignment with eastern boundary of No. 29 Liskeard Gardens. (This is the old boundary to the Blackheath Conservation Area).

From that point following along the eastern side boundary of No. 29 Liskeard Gardens to the rear of the property. Following westwards along the rear boundary of No. 27 Liskeard Gardens and then following the rear and side boundaries of Nos. 27-3 (odd) Liskeard Gardens to a point at the junction of Nos. 1 Liskeard Gardens and No. 11 Kidbrooke Gardens and following that boundary southwards to a point in alignment and on the mid-line of Kidbrooke Gardens. Following eastwards along the mid-line of Kidbrooke Gardens to meet the starting point at the junction.

GREENWICH LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

*Liskeard Gardens Conservation Area No. 10*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich by resolution dated 8th July 1976 and in accordance with section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 designated the area described below as a Conservation Area.

A plan showing the areas of land comprising the area and entitled "Liskeard Gardens Conservation Area No. 10", may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Borough Planning Officer, 45-53 Wellington Street, Woolwich, SE18 6RA.

The effect of this designation is as follows:—

- (1) In considering applications for planning permission in respect of land in or near the Conservation Area, a special procedure will be adopted, and special attention shall be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.
- (2) Buildings within the Conservation Area, with certain exceptions, cannot be demolished without the consent of the Council.
- (3) Trees in the Conservation Area, with certain exceptions, cannot be felled, topped, lopped, uprooted, or damaged, unless notice of intention to do the act in question has previously been served on the Council and a period of 6 weeks has expired without the making of a Tree Preservation Order.

*Description of Boundaries*

*Liskeard Gardens*

Following along the northern boundary of Kidbrooke Gardens (the side boundary of 2A Liskeard Gardens) to a point in alignment with the rear boundary of 2A.

The boundary follows northwards along the rear boundaries of 2A-14 to meet Liskeard Gardens at the front boundary of No. 27.

Following along eastwards past No. 29 to a point at the junction of the side boundary of No. 29.

Following the eastern boundary of No. 29 and coming westwards and southwards along the rear boundaries of Nos. 29-1 Liskeard Gardens to Kidbrooke Gardens.

Then following the southern boundary of No. 1 Liskeard Gardens to the side boundary of No. 2A.
