

The man ignored repeated requests to surrender and the police threw tear gas grenades into the house where he was hiding. As a result the man finally came through the rear door carrying the rifle.

The gunman pointed the weapon directly at Senior Constable Tunstall who, with two other policemen, had taken up a position beside a small shed at the back of the house. Senior Constable Tunstall ordered the man to drop the rifle immediately, but he ignored the Officer's order and fired a shot at him.

Senior Constable Tunstall then fired two warning shots from his Service revolver into the ground near the gunman. The man ignored the warning, however, and continued to fire in the direction of the three policemen. Senior Constable Tunstall returned the fire and during this exchange of shots he received a bullet wound to his right arm. Undaunted he stood ground and, having used up his ammunition, he took one of the other police officer's revolver and continued to fire in the gunman's direction.

The gunman was subsequently wounded and arrested by other police officers.

By facing this highly dangerous armed man and refusing to retreat even when wounded, Senior Constable Tunstall displayed outstanding bravery and devotion to duty.
