The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Holyhard) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1976, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act, 1974. The effect of the Order, which shall come into operation on 8th October 1976, will be:

- (a) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time in the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice :
- (b) to prohibit between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. any vehicle from waiting on any of the sides of road or in any of the lentghs of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice:
- (c) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on the side of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice for a longer period than 30 minutes in any period of one hour.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation, the removal

of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Exceptions have also been provided in the Order to allow: Exceptions have also been provided in the Order to allow:

(i) vehicles bearing both a disabled persons' badge and a parking disc to wait for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period of waiting separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length or the same side of road) in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of road specified in Schedules 1 and 2 to this notice;

(ii) vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge to wait for as long as may be necessary on the side of road

for as long as may be necessary on the side of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice.
