HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road and the St. Clears-Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road (St. Clears By-pass and Slip Roads) Order 1976.

and

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road and the St. Clears-Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road (St. Clears By-pass Side Roads) Order 1976.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders:

1. an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1969 which provides:

(a) that the roads which he proposes to construct at St. Clears in the County of Dyfed shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and

(b) that the lengths of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road and the St. Clears-Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be trunk roads as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Dyfed (who will become the highway authority responsible for those lengths) that the new trunk roads are open for through traffic; and

2. an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (b) to stop up highways;
- (c) to construct new highways;
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises;
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises

all at St. Clears aforesaid and to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Dyfed as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.
