Notice of Disclaimer under section 355 of the Companies Act, 1948

Whereas:

UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of St. John's College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 11th November 1976, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Paul's Old Churchyard, Hunwick in the County of Durham, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 30th day of July 1976, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith in St. Paul's Old Churchyard, Hunwick, in the County of Durham, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that-

(a) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that
