3. - (2) to prohibit vehicles from entering that length of the carriageway of Chestnut Grove which lies between the northwestern kerb-line of Balham High Road and a point 7 metres north-west of that kerb-line, in which length a barrier will be erected-coming into operation on 13th February 1977;
- (3) to impose one-way working for vehicular traffic in Oakmead Road between Ravenstone Street and Bedford Hill from north-west to south-east-coming into operation on 13th February 1977;
- (4) to prohibit the right-turn by vehicular traffic:

 (b) in relation to the prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2(1) above in respect of bicycles (not being motor vehicles) which follow the route through a barrier indicated by traffic signs;
 (c) in relation to the prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2(1) above (other than those referred to in sub-paragraph (1)(e), (h), (j), (k), (q) and (r)) in respect of vehicles being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes in emergency. in an emergency.
