PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Hybald's Hibaldstow, in the County of Humberside, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that burials should be discontinued forthwith in St. Hybald's Churchyard in the said Parish, shown hatched and outlined in black on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that the burial may be allowed in the said Churchyard at their decease of the bodies of Marjory Gilbert,

Lilian Cash, Annie Grayson Borrill, Annie Clark Cuthbert and Robert John Denton, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 14th day of February next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 14th day of February.
