The City of York (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on 30th December 1976, York City Council made an Order under section 31 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is:

- (a) to convert the Bootham Row and Haymarket Car Parks from long-stay to short-stay and operate them on a "pay and display" system i.e. a ticket or tickets for a period of waiting must be purchased at the time of leaving a vehicle—any person who either fails to purchase a ticket on leaving a vehicle or fails to purchase a further ticket before a period of waiting already paid for expires—will become liable to pay an excess charge of £1;
- (b) to convert the free car park at Cemetery Road known as the Winterscale Street Car Park to a paying long-stay car park for limited classes of vehicle—to be operated on the "Trust the Motorist" system;
- (c) to exclude goods vehicles in excess of 30 cwts. unladen weight from the Saint George's Fields and Monk Bar Car Parks.

 Lorry parking will still be available at the Union Terrace and Foss Bank Car Parks.

The permitted classes of vehicle, amount of charge etc., are as follows:
