NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

The Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council (Footpath 29 Hollingworth) Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 4th January 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way which runs in a general northerly direction from a point approximately 20 yards north of Printers Brow and to the north-west of the Etherow Works in Hollingworth for some 220 yards to Printers Fold, to a line running in the same general direction as the existing path, but running for some 120 yards in a north-westerly direction from a point approximately 20 yards north of Printers Brow and to the north-west of the Etherow Works, and then turning to run for some 40 yards in a north-easterly direction and then continuing to run in a north-westerly direction for a further length of approximately 130 yards to Manchester Road, Hollingworth.

Copies of the Order and the map contained in it have been deposited at the Information Office, Ashton-under-Lyne and the Information Office, Longdendale, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Fridays up to and including Friday 4th February 1977.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order should be sent in writing to the Director of Administration, Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council, Town Hall, Ashton-under-Lyne, quoting reference BL/158/WG to arrive not later than 4th February 1977, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

Three Rivers (Water Lane-Station Road) (Abbots Langley No. 53) Public Path Diversion Order 1976

VALE ROYAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

TOWN AND COUNTRY AMENITIES ACT 1974

Kingsley Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Vale Royal District Council in pursuance of its powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 have designated those parts of the Vale Royal District described in the Schedule below as Conservation Areas.

Plans showing the Conservation Areas may be inspected during office hours from Monday to Friday inclusive at:

- (1) The Secretary's Department, Whitehall, Hartford, Northwich;
- (2) The Planning Department, Over Hall, Winsford.

Attention is drawn to the effect of designation on the control of demolition of buildings and in the felling, lopping, topping or damaging of trees within a Conservation Area.

Section 277A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 applies to all buildings in conversation areas other than:

- (a) listed buildings (which are subject to control under other legislation);
- (b) "excepted" buildings under section 58(2) of the Act (Churches, chapels, ancient monuments which are subject to control under other Regulations);
- (c) buildings specified in a direction by the Secretary of State

and requires that any building to which section 277A applies shall not be demolished without the consent by the Secretary of State.

Section 61A of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 applies to all trees within Conservation Areas other than trees included in Tree Preservation Orders and prohibits the cutting down, lopping, topping, uprooting, wilful damage or wilful destruction of trees, except with consent of the Local Planning Authority or where a tree is dangerous.

SCHEDULE

Kingsley Conservation Area

Starting at the north-west of the Area, the boundary includes the Vicarage and St. John's Church and runs eastwards along Hollow Lane including various properties on both sides of the road. Kingsley Hall and properties around Brookside Farm are included as is much of the central area taking The Cross, The Brow and Brookside. The Area links through Wall Lane to The Hurst where the Area extends south from "South Hurst" to "Clifton House". Part of Chamber Brook Lane is also included. The south-west part of the Area extends along Dark Lane as far as the property known as "White Gate".
