TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of those lengths of highways described in the Schedule below to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted by the Cardiff City Council under Part III of that Act.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 13th January 1977 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The highways are in the City of Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan. They are shown by zebra hatching on the deposited plan and are:

1. That length of Barrack Lane which extends from its junction with Union Street in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 22 yards and then a south-easterly direction, for a further distance of 18 yards.
2. That length of the narrow strip of highway on the north-western side of Barrack Lane, located at a distance of 40 yards from its junction with Union Street and extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 27 yards.
