LUTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Luton (Dunstable Road) (Prohibition of Right-Hand Turns) Order, 1977

Notice is hereby given that Luton Borough Council, as agents of the Bedfordshire County Council, propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Act 1967, as amended, the effects of which will be:

(a) to prohibit any person from causing any vehicle to make a right-hand turn from Dunstable Road, Luton, into any of the roads listed in the Schedule to this notice, or to make a right-hand turn from any of the said roads into Dunstable Road; and

(b) to prohibit any person from causing any vehicle to proceed in either of the dual carriageways of the length of Dunstable Road, Luton, between its junction with Lewsey Road and the roundabout junction with Poynters Road and Skimpot Road in such direction other than so as to keep the central reservation on the right-hand or off-side of the vehicle.

A copy of the proposed Order, a map showing the roads to which the Order relates and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at my office in the Town Hall, Luton, during normal office hours.

GREATER MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL

The Greater Manchester County (Back St. Mary's Place, Bury) (Restriction of Waiting) (County) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th January 1977, the Greater Manchester County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, on both sides of Back St. Mary's Place, Bury, for its whole length.

The Order contains exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of boarding or alighting, loading or unloading, the removal of furniture, funerals, building operations or work on or under the length of road. In addition, disabled person's vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge and a parking disc will be able to wait for periods of up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within 6 weeks from 6th January 1977, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Traffic Regulation Orders, Manchester

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th January 1977 the Greater Manchester County Council made Orders under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974. The Orders and their effect are:

(a) The Greater Manchester County (Queens Road Extension, Manchester) (Prohibition of Waiting) (County) Order 1976.

To prohibit waiting at all times and to prohibit loading-unloading between 7.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. on Mondays to Saturdays and between 4 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays on:

Queens Road Extension, both sides of the new Link Road from the junction of Queens Road/Cheetham Hill Road to Elizabeth Street, close to its former junction with Markland Street.

The Order contains exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of boarding or alighting, loading or unloading (when not prohibited), the removal of furniture, funerals, building operations or work on or under the length of road. Disabled person's vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge and a parking disc will be allowed to wait for periods up to 2 hours when the loading ban is not in operation.

(b) The Greater Manchester County (Queens Road Extension and Cheetham Hill Road, Manchester) (Prohibition of Right Hand Turn) (County) Order 1976.

To prohibit any vehicle from making a right hand turn from the Queens Road Extension (new link road between Elizabeth Street and Queens Road) into Cheetham Hill Road.

Copies of the Orders which come into operation on the 17th January 1977 and a map showing the roads to which they relate may be inspected between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays at the County Secretary's Office, County Hall (Minshull Street entrance), Piccadilly Gardens, Manchester.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in them on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to either Order, may within 6 weeks from 11th January 1977 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
