NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

City of Bradford Metropolitan Council (Station Road Cullingworth) Public Path Diversion Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 24th December 1976 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by City of Bradford Metropolitan Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from Station Road, Cullingworth and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 53 metres and thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 62 metres, the alternative route being a footpath, minimum width 2 metres, commencing at Station Road, Cullingworth at the west side of Number 29 Station Road and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 68 metres and thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 76 metres.

Copies of the Order and the plan contained in it have been deposited at the Town Hall, Keighley, and at Sixth Floor, Provincial House, Bradford, and may be inspected free of charge between 0900 hours and 1600 hours Monday to Friday.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Solicitor, City Hall, Bradford, BD1 1HY before 16th February 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are made, or if any so made are withdrawn, City of Bradford Metropolitan Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

City of Bradford Metropolitan Council (Rose Bank Burley-in-Wharfedale No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd December 1976, City of Bradford Metropolitan Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from the north-eastern entrance of the railway underpass to the boundary of the Burley Woodhead Church of England School to a line running from and to the same points but not following the original line. The public right of way now follows a proposed footway in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 66 metres thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 10 metres across a proposed carriageway. Thence in a north-easterly direction veering to north-westerly along a proposed footway for a distance of 32 metres and continuing in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 10 metres across a proposed carriageway. Thence in an east-north-easterly direction for a distance of 17 metres.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Area Office, Station Road, Ilkley between 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Thursday and between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on a Friday.

This Order became operative from 23rd December 1976 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from the date on which notice is first published as required by

paragraph 6 of Schedule 20 to the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The City of Gloucester Footpath Number 28 Diversion Order (No. 2) 1976

Notice is hereby given that on the 9th December 1976 the Council of the City of Gloucester (hereinafter called "the Council") confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point on Hawthorne Avenue 80 metres south of the junction of Hawthorne Avenue and Redstart Way for a distance of 208 metres in a south-easterly direction to a line running from the said point on Hawthorne Avenue for a distance of 137 metres in a generally south-easterly direction then in an east-north-easterly direction for a distance of 74 metres then in a south-south-easterly direction for a distance of 45 metres and finally in a north-easterly direction for 28 metres rejoining the line of the existing footpath.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at Guildhall, Eastgate Street, Gloucester between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

This Order becomes operative as from the date that it is certified by the Council that an alternative footpath has been adequately provided but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 6 weeks from the 14th January 1977 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
