*The Kirklees (Binns Lane, Holmfirth) Public Path Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 12th January 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Kirklees Metropolitan Council as an unopposed Order.

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The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public right of way which runs from grid reference 1392 0827 being its junction with Binns Lane for a distance of 60 metres or thereabouts in a southerly direction and terminating at grid reference 1394 0821. The diverted path will run from grid reference 1392 0827 for a distance of 10 metres or thereabouts in a south-westerly direction to grid reference 1392 0826 then for a distance of 56 metres or thereabouts in a south-easterly direction to grid reference 1395 0822 and for a further distance of 12½ metres or thereabouts in a south-westerly direction to grid reference 1394 0821.

A copy of the Order and the plan contained in it has been deposited at Room 401, Kirklees House, Market Street, Huddersfield, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent to the Director of Administration, Kirklees House, Market Street, Huddersfield, not later than the 16th February 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Kirklees Metropolitan Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
