*The East Staffordshire District Council (Part of Footpath, Shobnall, Burton upon Trent) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 3rd December 1976, the East Staffordshire District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed without modification, is to divert part of the public footpath which crosses the footbridge over the Trent and Mersey Canal, Shobnall running from a point approximately 52 metres from Shobnall Street (Point "A") to a distance of 11 metres from the existing footbridge into Shobnall Fields (Point "B") to a line running from Point "A" along a parallel line to the south-west of the existing footpath over a newly constructed footbridge to Point "B".

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

*Public Paths (Lapley Nos. 15 and 16) Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order, made on the 10th January 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the South Staffordshire District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert (i) that part of Footpath No. 15, Wheaton Aston running from a point "A" at the paths commencement in field number 0700 in Marston Road, approximately 30 metres from the junction of Marston Road and Fenton House Lane and running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 94 metres to a point marked "B" on the boundary of field numbers 0700 and 1700 and (ii) that part of Footpath No. 16, Wheaton Aston starting from a point "E" at the paths commencement in field No. 1718 in Greenhill Lane and running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 120 metres to a point "F" in field No. 1718, to lines running respectively (i) from a point "C" in Marston Road approximately 12 metres south-east of the aforementioned point "A" and running in a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 94 metres to a point "D" and then in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 38 metres to rejoin the existing path at the aforementioned point "B" (ii) from the aforementioned point "E" in Greenhill Lane and running in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 90 metres to a point marked "G", then a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 70 metres to a point "H", then in a north-westerly direction for approximately 32 metres to a point "I" and then in a south-westerly direction for approximately 42 metres to rejoin the existing footpath at the aforementioned point "F".

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Codsall, Wolverhampton, during normal office hours on Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned before the 12th February 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Staffordshire District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not with drawn will be transmitted with the Order.
