WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

Chichester : Various Orders in Little London Area

Notice is hereby given that the West Sussex County Council propose to make the following Orders under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974:

1. *The County Council of West Sussex (Chichester : East Row and East Walls) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1977 ;*
2. *The County Council of West Sussex (Chichester : East Row) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1977 ;*
3. *The County Council of West Sussex (Chichester : Little London) (Length Restriction) Order, 1977 ; and*
4. *The County Council of West Sussex (Priory Road and Little London) (Prohibition of Driving) Order, 1977.*

These Orders will make permanent the experimental Orders which are at present in operation in this area and their effect will be:

1. To prohibit vehicles from proceeding in a direction other than eastwards in East Row and in a direction other than southwards in that length of East Walls between Priory Road and East Row.
2. To prohibit any vehicle from waiting between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on that length of the south side of East Row which extends from a point 15 yards east of its junction with Little London eastwards for a distance of 34 yards. The standard exceptions will be provided in the Order.
3. To prohibit vehicles of a length exceeding 30 feet, inclusive of any load on the vehicle, from proceeding in Little London between East Street and East Row.
4. To prohibit any vehicle from entering or leaving Priory Road at its junction with Little London and to allow vehicles to proceed in both directions in Little London between its junctions with East Row and Priory Road.

A copy of each of the draft Orders, a plan showing the lengths of road affected by the proposals and a statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Orders may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester during normal office hours or at the Public Library, Tower Street, during normal library opening hours. Library staff will not be in a position to answer questions on the proposals and any inquiries should be addressed to the undersigned.

Objections to the proposals, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 11th February 1977.

The County Council of West Sussex (Eastergate : Orchard Way) (Prohibition of Driving) Order, 1977

The County Council of West Sussex (Pagham : King's Drive (Part)) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 19th January 1977, the West Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit vehicles from proceeding southwards along King's Drive in the Parish of Pagham between Payne Close and Link Way on the west side of the traffic island at the junction of the two roads.

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Chichester : Oving Road (B.2144)) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 19th January 1977, the West Sussex County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting on the south side of Oving Road (B.2144) in Chichester, from a point 40.5 metres west of Florence Road, westwards to Whyke Road.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable vehicles to stop and pick up and set down passengers, goods or merchandise, to wait when engaged in building operations or the repair of the road or the services therein or to take in petrol, oil, air or water from a garage and in connection with funerals. Disabled person's vehicles displaying in the relevant positions a disabled persons' badge, issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons' (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations, 1975 and a parking disc will be permitted to wait in the lengths of road above for periods of up to 2 hours, their return being prohibited within 1 hour.
