North Yorkshire County Council Public Path Diversion Order (Thornton Dale) 1976

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 13th December 1976, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the North Yorkshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed, without modification, will be to extinguish a footpath situate within the Ryedale District Council, namely the public footpath running from Roxby Road in the Parish of Thornton Dale and create an alternative footpath in lieu.

Description of Site of existing Path or Way

Marked in purple between A, B, C and D on the plan.	Commences at Point "A" on Roxby Road and runs in a westerly direction through O.S. Field 742 on the Ordnance Survey plan 91/16 (1928 Edition) into O.S. Field 753 to point "C" and then turns in a southerly direction down the eastern boundary of O.S. Fields 753 and 754 to rejoin the existing line of the footpath at Point "D".

PART II

Description of site of new path or Way

Section of path or way as indicated.	Commences at Point "B" in O.S. Field 742 on the Ordnance Survey plan 91/16 (1928 Edition) and runs in a southerly direction through O.S. Field 741 into O.S. Field 739 a distance of 120 metres then turns generally westerly through O.S. Fields 739, 736 and into 754 to join the existing path at point "D" a distance of approximately 86 metres. The diverted line of the footpath between points "B" and "D" follows the line of housing estate roads which will be adopted as highways maintainable at public expense on satisfactory completion.
