CUMBRIA COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cumbria (Borough of Barrow-in-Furness) (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 10th January 1977, the Council of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness made the above Order under Section 31(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972.

The Order controls the use of the parking places named in the Schedule to this Notice which shows the classes of vehicles, the days and times of operation, the maximum period for waiting and the scale of charges for each parking place.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the location of the parking places are available at the Town Hall, Barrow-in-Furness, where they may be examined between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it on the grounds that it does not come within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 10th January, 1977, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

EPPING FOREST DISTRICT COUNCIL

Epping Forest District (Fairmead Road, Buckhurst Hill) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Epping Forest District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Essex in exercise of the powers of the said County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2), (3) and 69 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order will be to close that length of Fairmead Road, Buckhurst Hill, extending from its junction with the A.11 Epping New Road to Palmers Bridge a distance of 140 metres in a north-westerly direction.

When the Order becomes operative access to the unaffected part of Fairmead Road from the A.11 will be via the Robin Hood Roundabout and Cross Roads.

The draft Order which together with a map showing the length of road concerned, and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the Council Offices, 323 High Street, Epping; Old Station Road, Loughton and Town Hall, Waltham Abbey, during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by Monday, 14th February 1977.
