TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Notice of Designation of a Conservation Area for Condover

Notice is hereby given that the Shrewsbury and Atcham Borough Council, as the Local Planning Authority, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, has designated an area at Condover in the County of Salop specified in the Schedule to the notice as a Conservation Area. The area concerned is considered to be of special architectural or historic interest, the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance. The effects of designating the specified area of Condover as a Conservation Area are as follows:

- (1) Special attention shall be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.
- (2) Demolition of property within the area becomes subject to the controls applying to listed buildings (with similar exceptions).
- (3) All planning applications likely to affect the character and appearance of the area will be advertised and representations received will be carefully considered by the Council before reaching a decision on the proposal.
- (4) The felling of trees, other than dangerous trees (and certain other exceptions), can only be carried out after six weeks' notice is given to the Council.

(5) The Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment may implement special control over advertisements within the area.

In addition the Local Planning Authority will, if it deems it necessary, seek approval of the Secretary of State for the Environment to bring under control particular classes of development otherwise permitted by the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1973.

A plan showing the boundaries of the area, together with a statement setting out the Council's policy for the area, is available for inspection, during normal office hours at the Guildhall, Dogpole, Shrewsbury.

SCHEDULE

Condover Conservation Area

The designated area covers the area of the old village of Condover and may be roughly described as falling within the following boundaries:

- (a) That section of the Cound Brook stretching between the sewerage works and Condover Bridge ; and
- (b) From Condover Bridge in a northerly direction to Condover C.E. (Aided) School ; and
- (c) From Condover C.E. (Aided) School in a south-easterly direction to re-join the sewerage works.

the exact area can however only be determined by reference to the Conservation Area Map.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 SECTION 210

The Vale Royal District Council (Footpath No. 3) Comberbach Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 25th January 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Vale Royal District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert a section of the public right of way numbered 3 on the definitive map for the Comberbach area of the Vale Royal District prepared under the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 (Part IV) running south-westerly approximately 270 metres from Cogshall Lane to "The Moss" to a line running south-west for approximately 75 metres along the new Cogshall Lane and then south-easterly for some 240 metres and then easterly for 35 metres to reach "The Moss".

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of Vale Royal District Council, Over Hall, Winsford, Cheshire and may be inspected, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent, in writing, to the undersigned at Whitehall, Hartford, Northwich, Cheshire, not later than the 26th February 1977, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, Vale Royal District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representation and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
