### ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS 1913 TO 1953

#### The Alcester Roman Town Preservation Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953 and now vested in him, has, on 18th January 1977, made an order with the above title, placing under his more lasting protection the ancient monument known as Alcester Roman Town in the parish of Alcester in the County of Warwickshire, in respect of which an interim preservation notice served under section 10 of the said Act was in force

The effect of the Order will be as follows:

- (a) while it remains in force, the monument shall not be demolished or removed, nor shall any additions or alterations be made thereto or any work carried out in connection therewith, except with the written consent of the Secretary of State granted either unconditionally or subject to such conditions as the Secretary of State thinks fit:
- (b) a person having an interest in the whole or part of the monument may be able to claim compensation under section 12 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monu-ments Act 1953, and any question of a person's right to compensation or the amount thereof shall, in de-fault of agreement, be determined by the Lands Tribunal;
- (c) if, while the order is in force, it appears to the Secre-tary of State that owing to neglect the monument is likely to fall into decay, the Secretary of State may make an order constituting himself guardian of the monument; and
