

SCHEDULE 1

Method of Payment

The method of payment to Royal Navy and Royal Marine personnel (i.e. payment in cash or by direct credit to the individual's personal bank account) shall be at the discretion of the Admiralty Board.

SCHEDULE 2

Pay Supplement—Officers (except Flag Officers) Royal Navy and Royal Marines

From 1st April 1976 a weekly pay supplement of £6 is payable in addition to the basic rates contained in the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) Order 1976 within the constraints imposed by the pay policy described in Her Majesty's Government's White Papers—the Attack on Inflation (Cmnd. 6151), and the Attack on Inflation The Second Year (Cmnd. 6507).

SCHEDULE 3

Pay Supplement—Ratings, Royal Navy and Royal Marines Other Ranks

From 1st April 1976 a weekly pay supplement, in addition to the basic rates contained in the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) Order 1976, is payable as follows:

- (a) for all Royal Navy Ratings, and Royal Marine Other Ranks, aged 17½ and over except apprentices (see (c) below)—£6;
(b) for Juniors Royal Navy and Royal Marines under age 17½:

SCHEDULE 4

London Pay

1. London Pay may be awarded in accordance with the regulations laid down by the Admiralty Board to regular Royal Navy and Royal Marine personnel (up to and including Captain Royal Navy and equivalent with effect from 1st April 1974 and up to Rear Admiral and equivalent with effect from 1st June 1975) who are drafted, attached, or appointed for duty at establishments in the London area.

2. London Pay is an additional taxable emolument intended to ensure broad comparability of real earnings between those personnel who work in London and those who work elsewhere. The rates determined from time to time take account of the extra costs, wear and tear and varying standards of housing associated with a period of duty in London not otherwise compensated for by other payments.

3. The daily rates payable are as follows:
