COUNTER-INFLATION ACT, 1973

Certificate of the Secretary of State for Prices and Consumer Protection under paragraph 103 of Schedule 1 to the Counter-Inflation (Price Code) Order 1976.

The Secretary of State for Prices and Consumer Protection, having regard to the need to remove or reduce a serious threat of a significant adverse effect on the United Kingdom balance of payments, hereby certifies in relation to poly-chloroprene that there is such a threat and specifies in relation to increases in its price implemented while this certificate is in force that the departures from the provisions of the Code relating to net profit margins set out in the Schedule to this Certificate shall be permitted by the Price Commission.

This Certificate shall have effect until varied or revoked. Dated 7th February 1977.

SCHEDULE

Such departures from the provisions of the Code relating to net profit margins as will allow:

(a) any unit of an enterprise which is a unit engaged in the manufacture of polychloroprene (a "relevant unit") to be treated as if it constituted at all times before the date of this Certificate and continues to constitute a unit for profit margin control separate from that unit for profit margin control (the "principal unit") of which, apart from this Certificate, it forms part and its reference level to be calculated accordingly;

(b) the net profit margins and reference level of the principal unit to be re-calculated excluding the sales and profits or losses of any relevant unit; and

(b) provide that the parking places would be in operation between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank

Holidays excepted);

(c) specify that, in respect of the metered parking places, passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles or invalid carriages may be left

vehicles, motor cycles or invalid carriages may be left therein and in respect of residents' parking places, that vehicles displaying a valid permit in a protective cover issued by this Council may be left therein; (d) provide that permits and protective covers may be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by any person residing in Alton Road, Dunstable Road and part of Sheen Road or in any street or part of street to which the provisions of the Richmond upon Thames (Parking Places) Order 1973 applies who is the owner of a passenger vehicle (12 seats or less), a goods carrying vehicle not more than 7 feet 6 inches in height, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage; carriage;

(e) specify that:

(i) in the metered, 2 hour parking places, the initial charge is at the rate of 10 new pence for a period of 1 hour plus any unexpired time shown on the parking meter provided that the maximum initial period does not exceed 2 hours;
(ii) in the residents' parking places, the charge for the issue of a permit is £4, £7 or £13 for permits expiring at the end of 3 months, 6 months and 12 months respectively running from the beginning of the month in which they are issued;
(iii) in respect of the metered parking places the

(iii) in respect of the metered parking places, the excess charge—payable to the Borough—is £2; the excess charge period is 2 hours; the unexpired time shown on the parking meter may be used free of charge; and the period during which vehicles may not return to a parking place is 1 hour;

(f) provide that permits issued in respect of the extended controlled area would be interavailable with those issued in respect of the existing controlled parking zone in the Richmond area in the said London Borough;

(g) provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes) to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) or vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

The proposed Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would amend the Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that:

(a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited, except in the designated parking places:

(i) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to

Saturdays inclusive in part of Sheen Road;

(ii) between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in parts of Alton Road and Dunstable Road;

- (b) the hours during which existing prohibition on waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) applies would be varied in part of Dunstable Road to between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;
- (c) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same

place would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the parts of streets referred to in paragraphs (a) or (b) above;

above;
(d) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle
in the parts of streets referred to in paragraphs (a)
or (b) above would be prohibited, except on a Sunday,
unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the
Richmond upon Thames Borough Council or the goods
are immediately taken into or delivered at premises
adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(e) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, in the parts of streets referred to in paragraphs (a) or (b) above

would be prohibited.

The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 4 above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g. the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers that the property of paragraph at a from progeside or duties, the taking in of petrol etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply.
