Y SWYDDFA GYMREIG HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Fishguard—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (Closure of Access to Premises at Rhyd-y-Pennau, Dyfed) Order 1976.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 2 of the Highways Act 1971, authorising him to stop up private means of access to premises known as Carreg Lwyd from the Fishguard—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road at Rhyd-y-Pennau in the county of Dyfed because he considers that the means of access is likely to cause danger to traffic on that road.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of either of those Acts, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 11th February 1977 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
