HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The London-Tilbury Trunk Road (Mar Dyke to East Grays Section Supplementary Side Roads) Order 19

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the new Trunk Road to be constructed by him as a bypass to Grays Thurrock in the County of Essex to make under sections 9 and 286 of the Highways Act 1959 an Order which will:

The Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) Order 1977 (Made 10th January 1977)

This Order which came into operation on the 31st January 1977 revokes and re-enacts with amendments the lists of disinfectants approved by the Minister and the Secretary of State in the Schedule to the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) Order 1972, as amended.

The Schedule, as re-enacted contains lists of approved disinfectants in relation to orders under the Diseases of Animals Act 1950 dealing with Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Part I-A), Swine Vesicular Disease (Part I-B, Sections 1 and 2), Fowl Pest (Part II), Tuberculosis (Part III) and disinfectants approved until further notice in relation to other general orders made under the Diseases of Animals Act (Part IV).

The order also extends until 31st July 1977 the period for which disinfectants approved in respect of swine vesicular disease, and listed in Section 2 of Part I-B, shall remain approved.

Provision is also made for the continued use of approved disinfectants now deleted from the Schedule for a transitional period from the coming into operation of this order until 30th June 1977.
