Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Islington propose to apply to the Greater London Council for an Order to be entitled the Islington (Parking Places) (No. 1 1976) (Amendment No. ) Order 197 under sections 35, 36, 37, 40 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1968.

- 5. Any person desiring to object to the proposed Order should send a statement in writing of his objection and the grounds thereof to the Director of Planning and Transportation, The County Hall, SE1 7PB not later than the date specified in paragraph 4 above quoting the reference PT/TD/PO/R.
- 6. Further notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Islington propose to apply to the Greater London Council for Orders to be entitled the Islington (Parking Places) (No. ) Order 197 under sections 35, 36, 37, 40 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Islington (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Amendment No. ) Order 197 under sections 6 and 84D of the above-mentioned Act of 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.
  - 7. The general effect of the Parking Places Order would be-
    - (a) to revoke the designation by the Islington (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 of the parking places allocated the number specified in column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Notice and which is situated on the highway specified in column 2 of that Schedule and is the type of parking place indicated in column 3 of that Schedule;

- (b) designate parking places on the highways specified in column 1 of Schedule 4 to this Notice at which charges may be made by this Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places and provide that the type of parking place so designated would be as set out in column 2 of that Schedule;
- (c) to provide that the parking places would operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
- (d) to specify that the vehicles which may be left-
  - (i) in a resident's parking place shall be those displaying a valid resident's permit; and
  - (ii) in a business user's parking place shall be those displaying a valid business permit—in either case such permits would be issued under the provisions of the Islington (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 by this Council;
- (e) to specify that in respect of a business user's parking place, the charge would be £150 for the issue of a business permit valid for a period of 12 months and this permit must be displayed on the vehicle;
- (f) to specify that in respect of a resident's parking place the charge would be at the rate of 12½p a day;
  N.B.—If a resident's season ticket is displayed on a vehicle left in a resident's parking place, the daily charge is not payable. Season tickets cost £2.75, £7.50 or £26 for tickets expiring at the end of 1 month, 3 months and 12 months respectively running from the beginning of the month in which they are issued;
- (g) to provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).
- 8. The restrictions imposed by the Islington (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 would apply to any area previously designated as a parking place and not re-designated as such, as they apply in the immediate vicinity.
- 9. The Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would further amend the Islington (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that—
  - (a) restrictions on waiting by vehicles (other than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be imposed between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays in the whole length of Canonbury Road (any such existing restrictions would be revoked);
  - (b) the hours during which the existing prohibition on waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle apply on certain lengths of Canonbury Road would be varied—

     (i) so that in respect of the lengths which are now restricted between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to
    - (i) so that in respect of the lengths which are now restricted between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, the times would be varied so as to apply between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays; and
    - (ii) so that in respect of the lengths which are now restricted between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, the times would be varied so as to apply between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;
  - (c) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be prohibited for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 11 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays in the length of street referred to in paragraph 9(a) above:
  - (d) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle would be prohibited in the lengths of street referred to in paragraph 9(a) above, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by this Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;
  - (e) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising in the lengths of street referred to in paragraph 9(a) above, will be prohibited;
  - (f) cycle parking areas would be designated in Cruden Street, Gibson Square and Highbury Crescent.
- 10. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 9(a) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g. mechanically-propelled bicycles waiting in the above-mentioned cycle parking areas; the picking up or setting down of passengers, the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply.
- 11. A copy of each of the proposed Orders, of the Islington (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976, of the Islington (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have amended that Order), of this Council's statement of reasons for applying for the Orders and of the map which indicates each length of road to which the Orders relate can be inspected between the times and at the addresses stated in paragraph 4 above.
- 12. Any person desiring to object to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of his objection and the grounds thereof to the Director of Planning and Transportation, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB not later than the date specified in paragraph 4 above quoting the reference PT/TD/PO/R.

### SPECIAL NOTE

13. The residents parking place charges are however under review and a separate application for an Order to increase the charges may be made prior, and if authorised implemented, before the making of the above proposed amending Order.
