*Somerset (Footpath No. 5/7 at Chilcompton) Public Path Diversion Order 1976*

Notice is hereby given that on the 25th February 1977, the Somerset County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that part of Footpaths 5/7 in the parish of Chilcompton in the District of Mendip which runs from a point approximately 20 yards south-east of its junction with Parsonage Lane in a generally easterly direction for a distance of approximately 186 yards; to run from the said point 20 yards south-east of the junction with Parsonage Lane in a generally south-easterly and then easterly direction to the south of its original route for a total distance of approximately 203 yards to rejoin its former route.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders, made on 18th February 1977 are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as unopposed Orders, by the West Sussex County Council.

The effect of the Orders, if confirmed without modification, will be to:

(1) Divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 583) in the Parish of Kirdford, by stopping up the path commencing at its junction with the maintainable highway (Streels Lane), extending south-westwards for a distance of approximately 280 feet, and substitute for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing on the maintainable highway (Streels Lane) at a point approximately 130 feet south of its original junction, extending westwards for a distance of approximately 270 feet to join the original route at the south-western end of the length of path to be stopped up.

(2) Extinguish part of the public footpath (Path No. 584) in the Parishes of Northchapel and Kirdford, commencing at its junction with the public bridleway (Path No. 559), extending generally north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,490 feet to its junction with the new public footpath (New Claim 330).

(3) Divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 586) in the Parishes of Northchapel and Lurgashall, by stopping up the path commencing at a point 50 feet south-east of its junction with the maintainable highway approximately 1,000 feet north of Burroughesmere, extending south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,200 feet, thence eastwards for a distance of approximately 960 feet and substitute for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the western end of the length of path to be stopped up, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 130 feet, thence generally eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,900 feet, thence generally south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 150 feet, thence generally southwards for a distance of approximately 400 feet, to join the eastern end of the length of path to be stopped up.
