WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Bradford) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 23) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council made the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 7th March 1977 is to prohibit the driving of vehicles (except omnibuses) on the slip road (near Stony Lane) on the old alignment of Prunè Park Lane, Bradford, and also to institute a one-way traffic system on the road in a general north-westerly direction.

The part of the Order relating to the prohibition of driving will contain exemptions for emergency services vehicles and vehicles when being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads affected may be inspected during normal office hours at the County Hall (Room 226), Wakefield, or at the DoPET Traffic Unit, Princes House, Wadley Centre, Little Horton Lane, Bradford.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date of the making of the Order, i.e. 1st March 1977, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Kirklees (Crawthorne Crescent, Keldregate, Huddersfield) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th October 1976, Kirklees Metropolitan Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way which runs from grid reference 1622 1974 for a distance of 35 metres or thereabouts in a north-easterly direction to its junction with Crawthorne Crescent at grid reference 1626 1976. The diverted path runs from grid reference 1622 1974 for a distance of 30 metres or thereabouts in an easterly direction to grid reference 1626 1975 then along Crawthorne Crescent in a northerly direction to grid reference 1626 1976.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the plan contained in it has been deposited at Kirklees House, Market Street, Huddersfield and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from Tuesday, 8th March, 1977 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 8th March 1977, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971, SECTION 210

The Medina Borough Council (Public Footpath CS. 29 Trinity Road to Castle Street, East Cowes) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 4th March 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Medina Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point on public footpath CS.29 at the south western corner of the property known as 10 Dover Road, East Cowes, Isle of Wight, approximately twenty eight metres from Castle Street, in a west-north-westerly direction for approximately 22 metres to a point in Trinity Road, East Cowes, approximately 18 metres south of Dover Road to a line running from a point on public footpath CS.29 at the south-western corner of the property known as 10 Dover Road, East Cowes, approximately 28 metres from Castle Street, in a north-north-easterly direction for approximately 16 metres adjacent to the north-western boundary of the property known as 10 Dover Road, East Cowes, to a point in Dover Road approximately 19 metres east of Trinity Road.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council's offices at 17 Quay Street, Newport, Isle of Wight, between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and between 2 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Medina Borough Council, 17 Quay Street, Newport, Isle of Wight, not later than 14th April 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Medina Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

If you wish to be notified if the Order is confirmed, and to have a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Secretary, Medina Borough Council, 17 Quay Street, Newport, Isle of Wight, giving your name and address to which those documents may be sent.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 SECTION 210

Sedgefield District Council Footpath No. 7 (Part of) (Cornforth Parish) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 23rd February 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Sedgefield District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of Public Footpath No. 7 in the parish of Cornforth from its western terminus at New Road Terrace for a distance of 133 metres or thereabouts in an easterly direction to its junction with Public Footpath No. 8 to a line running from the said western terminus of Public Footpath No. 7 but following a new footpath to be constructed by Sedgefield District Council as part of the Barratt Way new housing development, approximately parallel to and at a maximum divergence of 13 metres to the north of the existing right of way, rejoining footpath No. 7 at the said junction with footpath No. 8.
