with Church Street for a distance of 15 yards in a northerly direction.

- 2. Green Lane, Leominster. Waiting prohibited between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays on both sides of Green Street from its junction with New Street to the west side of its junction with Cranes Lane.
- 3. Burgess Street, Leominster. The existing prohibition of waiting at all times extended to apply on both sides to the whole of the length of street.
- 4. Rainbow Street, Leominster

(i) Waiting prohibited at all times on both sides of the road from its junction with West Street northwards for 10 yards; on the west side from opposite the north side of Burgess Street southwards for a distance of 50 yards; on the east side from a point 50 yards south of Burgess Street northwards to its junction with New Street;

(ii) Waiting restricted to one hour, return prohibited within two hours, on Mondays to Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays on both sides from 50 yards south of Burgess Street to 10 yards north of West Street.

- 5. South Street, Leominster. The existing restriction of waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on both sides of the road between its junction with Westbury Street and Etnam Street amended so that parking is prohibited at all times.
- 6. Bargates, Leominster. Prohibit waiting at all times on both sides of the road from the end of the existing prohibition to a point outside the Radnor Arms Public House, a distance of 80 yards on the north side and 120 yards on the south side.
- 7. Ryelands Road, Leominster. Prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays from its junction with Westbury Street to the Police Station, a distance of 103 yards.

Waiting by vehicles of the undermentioned classes or for the undermentioned purposes is exempt from the provisions of the Order:

- 1. to enable persons to board or alight;
- 2. to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded ;
- 3. to enable certain essential works to be carried out or in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- 4. vehicles in use by the Post Office;
- 5. for the collection or delivery of furniture or effects ;
- 6. for fire, police or ambulance purposes;
- 7. to obtain certain services from a garage;
- 8. disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme.

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Leominster) (Street Parking Places) Order 1976

This Order provides that waiting be restricted to one hour in any two hours period between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays on (i) the west side of Broad Street, Leominster between the sides of lengths of road affected by the existing waiting prohibitions, vehicles to park in echelon and (ii) on the east side of Broad Street, Leominster from a point 15 yards north of its junction with Church Street to the end of the side of length of road affected by the existing waiting prohibition. The Order also consolidates the existing provision for street parking for one hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in parking bays in the centre of Corn Square, Leominster but amends this provision so that in future it only applies to Mondays to Thursdays and Saturdays.

Disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme are exempt from the provision of this Order.

The Orders will come into operation on 11th March 1977. A copy of the Orders as made and a copy of the relevant map can be inspected at The Shirehall, Worcester, between 9.30 a.m.-12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m.-4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in the Orders on the ground that they are not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Orders were made (such date stated in this Notice) make application for the purpose to the High Court.
