Ogwr Borough Council (Footpath Nos. 1 and 7 in the Community of Llangynwyd Lower) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976.

Notice is hereby given that on the 9th February 1977 the Ogwr Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way (Footpath No. 1) running from a point near Gadlys in the Community of Llangynwyd Middle, marked "A" on the map contained in the Order, in a south-westerly direction to a point where it meets Footpath No. 10, to a line running from the said point "A" near Gadlys, in a north-westerly and then westerly direction to where it meets Footpath No. 10 some 167.6 metres north of point "B".

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, will also be to divert the public right of way (Footpath No. 7) running from a point near Bryn-Cynan marked "E" on the map contained in the Order in a westerly direction to a point "C" where Footpath No. 7 crosses the Nant Bryncynan stream to a line running from the said point "E" near Bryn-Cynan running in a northerly and then north-easterly direction to a point where it meets Footpath No. 1, thereby connecting with Footpath No. 7.

A copy of the Order, as confirmed, and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Post Office, Llangynwyd, near Maesteg and the Ogwr Borough Council Offices, Municipal Buildings, Queen Street, Bridgend, during normal hours of business.

Any person who wishes to claim compensation under section 113 (2) of the 1959 Act for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Order must make his claim in writing addressed to the Secretary, Ogwr Borough Council, Municipal Buildings, Queen Street, Bridgend, Mid-Glamorgan, and serve it by delivering it at or sending it by pre-paid post to the above address before the 19th August 1977.

The Order became operative as from 9th March 1977, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under Paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by Paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 11th March 1977, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
