NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDERS

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Kingswood District Council (POL.21 Oldland) and (POL.24 Oldland) Public Path Orders 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th March 1977 the Kingswood District Council confirmed without modification the above-named Orders.

The effect of the Orders, as confirmed, is to divert:

1. A section of the public right of way POL.21 running between Willsbridge Hill and Shellards Road commencing at a point approximately 100 metres from Willsbridge Hill and running in a northerly direction for 120 metres and then north-west for a further 120 metres to its junction with Long Beach Road. The diversion runs along estate roads and footpaths between the two points for a total distance of 286 metres.
2. The section of the public right of way POL.24 running from its junction with footpath POL.21 (Willsbridge Hill to Shellards Road) in a north-easterly direction for 156 metres. The diversion runs over estate footpaths constructed on a line to the south-east of the original path for a distance of 196 metres.

Copies of the confirmed Orders and maps contained in them have been deposited at the Council Offices, 26 South View, Staple Hill, Bristol, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m.—1 p.m. and 2 p.m.—5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The Orders became operative on the 7th March 1977, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 22nd March 1977, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Middlesbrough Borough Council (Hemlington Hall Road, Hemlington) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that Middlesbrough Borough Council have confirmed the above-named Order since there are no outstanding objections to it.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the bridleway which is situated north of Hemlington Hall Road and south of the Parkway/A.19, to a position east of the existing bridleway. The new bridleway which will be 95 metres in length will run approximately parallel to the existing bridleway linking up with the new footbridge which crosses the Parkway/A.19 and linking up with the existing bridleway.

The District of Montgomery (Footpath No. 2, Barnfields, Newtown) Public Path Diversion Order 1977
