CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (Respryn Bridge and Lanhydrock House Bridge) (Width Restriction) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on the 14th March 1977, the Cornwall County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is (i) to prohibit the driving of any vehicle the width of which, inclusive of any load, exceeds 7 feet in that length of Bodmin-Fairy Cross Road (Class III) situated in the Parishes of Lanhydrock and St. Winnow, which extends between points 146 yards and 315 yards north-west of its junction with the Class III road to West Taphouse; (ii) to revoke the exemption for public service vehicles in respect of the existing weight restriction on that length of the Bodmin-Fairy Cross Road (Class III) carried by Lanhydrock House Bridge in the Parish of St. Winnow.

The Devon County Council (Rolle Bridge, Barnstaple) (Weight Restriction) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 21st March 1977, the Devon County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle, the axle weight of which exceeds 7 tons, from proceeding over Rolle Bridge on the Barnstaple/Ilfracombe Road (A.361).
