## OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Oxfordshire County Council (Foliat Drive, (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1977 Wantage)

Notice is hereby given that on the 17th March 1977 the Oxfordshire County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to reduce the existing prohibition on the waiting of vehicles along the north side of Foliat Drive, Wantage and to impose a similar prohibition on parts of the south side.
