COAST PROTECTION ACT 1949

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BASILDON DISTRICT COUNCIL

The District of Basildon (Cranes Farm Road, A.1235 and Broadmayne, A132) (24 Hour Main Carriageway Clearway) Order 1977.

Notice is hereby given that on 24th March 1977 the Basildon District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Essex, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Essex Police in accordance with section 84C (i) of the said Act of 1967 made the above Order.

The effect of this Order is to prohibit vehicles from stopping at any time along the whole length of Cranes Farm Road between its junctions with Upper Mayne and East Mayne and along the whole length of Broadmayne from

its junction with Southernhay/Ghyllgrove to its junction with East Mayne/South Mayne.

The Order will be operative from 28th March 1977.

A copy of the Order and a plan showing the lengths of highway which are affected by the Order are available for inspection at the Council Offices, Fodderwick, Basildon, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 25th March 1977, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The District of Basildon (Industrial Area No. 1) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that Basildon District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Essex County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Essex Police propose to make the above Order.

The proposed Order in conjunction with the Urban District of Basildon (Traffic Regulation) (No. 2) Order 1972 will have the effect of prohibiting waiting at any time on either side of any of the following lengths of roads:

Christopher Martin Road, from its junction with Gardiners Lane eastwards to a point 51.1 metres east of the eastern kerb of Honeywood Road.

Gardiners Lane, from its junction with Southend Arterial Road (A.127) to a point 150 metres south of this junction.

Honeywood Road, from its junction with Christopher Martin Road to its junction with Paycocke Road.

Restrictions will still apply to the other portions of road as listed in the Schedule to the 1972 Order.
