*The District of Yeovil (South Cheriton and Horsington)
Traffic Regulation Order 1975*

Notice is hereby given that the Yeovil District Council made an Order on the 21st March 1977, under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Act 1967 (as amended) pursuant to arrangements with the Somerset County Council under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, which comes into operation on the 28th March 1977, the effect of which is to prohibit the use of Cabbage Lane, South Cheriton and Mead Lane, Horsington, to vehicles having a width (inclusive of any load) exceeding 6 feet 6 inches. The Order includes exceptions for access, agriculture and for building operations and such like.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County of North Yorkshire propose to make an Order to be entitled "(Victoria Grove, Ripon) (Off-Street Parking Places) Order, 1977" under section 31 (1) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Local Government Act 1974.

The effect of the Order is:

- (a) to make provision as to the use of the Victoria Grove, Ripon, Car Park, in particular as to the class of vehicle which may be entitled to use it;

The Council of the County of North Yorkshire (Harrogate) (Tower Street Surface Level) (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1977.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County of North Yorkshire propose to make an Order under section 31 (1) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 of the Local Government Act 1974.

The general nature and effect of the Order is to make provision as to the use of the Tower Street Surface Level Parking Place and in particular as to the vehicles or class of vehicles which may be entitled to use it, as to the conditions on which they may use it and as to the removal therefrom of a vehicle left there in contravention of the Order and the safe custody of the vehicle.

Provision has been made in the Order to enable a charge for car parking to be made on any day other than a Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or other public holiday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. The charge payable will be at the rate of ten pence for 2 hours and twenty pence for up to 12 hours with an excess charge of one pound.

Particulars of the classes of vehicle for which the said parking place is available are set out in the Order.
