NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971, SECTION 210

The Hertfordshire County Council (CRF.9 Sacombe Road, Hertford) Public Path Diversion Order, 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 23rd March 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Hertfordshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the following public right of way:

Description of site of existing path

A length of CRF.9/FP.9 from the junction with Sacombe Road at Point A on the plan, generally north-westwards for a distance of approximately 624 yards (570 metres) to Point D.

Description of site of alternative path

A footpath 6 feet wide, commencing from Sacombe Road at Point A thence north and north-westwards for a distance of approximately 446 yards (408 metres) to Point B thence south-westwards along south side of the hedge boundary through gap in hedge and along track, a total distance of approximately 210 yards (192 metres) to Point C, thence north-westwards for a distance of approximately 166 yards (146 metres) to Point D.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the East Hertfordshire District Council, Council Offices, The Causeway, Bishop's Stortford, and at the offices of the Hertfordshire County Council, Room 204, County Hall, Hertford, and may be inspected during usual office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Secretary, Hertfordshire County Council, County Hall, Hertford not later than the 22nd April 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Hertfordshire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment, for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The Kirklees (Warburton Road, Emley) Public Path Diversion Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that on 11th March 1977, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert a length of public Footpath Number 21 (Denby Dale) which commences at its junction with Footpath Number 96 (Denby Dale) and proceeds in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 100 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Footpath Number 22 (Denby Dale). The diverted path commences at its junction with Footpath Number 96 (Denby Dale) and proceeds in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 77 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Footpath Number 22 (Denby Dale).

A copy of the confirmed Order and the plan contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, Skelmanthorpe, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from Friday 25th March, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971 within 6 weeks from 25th March 1977, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
