

Areas. The effects of such designations are that subject to the provisions of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974, and the exemptions contained therein, or made by virtue of, any statutory provision therein, no building or part of a building which is situated within the Conservation Areas shall be demolished without the consent first obtained of either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State for the Environment. Furthermore at least 6 weeks notice must be given to the District Council of any intention to lop or fell any tree within the areas. Copies of plans of the Conservation Areas have been deposited at the offices of the District Secretary, West Norfolk District Council, Baxters Plain, King's Lynn, and the Southern Area Manager, Priory Road, Downham Market, in respect of the Boughton Conservation Area, and at the offices of the Northern Area Manager, Station Road, Docking, in respect of the Burnham Overy Staithe, Burnham Overy Town and Burnham Thorpe Conservation Areas, and may be inspected at any time during normal office hours.

## SCHEDULE

## (a) Boughton

All that land in the Parish of Boughton bounded on the east by the Rectory, on the west by Cavenham Corner, on the south by the properties fronting the Main Street and the Pond, and on the north by Church Lane.

## (b) Burnham Overy Staithe

All that land at Burnham Overy Staithe bounded on the north by the coastline, the south by the properties fronting the A.149, together with the playing field and children's playground and on the east and west by the extremities of the village in those directions.

## (c) Burnham Overy Town

All the properties in Burnham Overy Town together with the road between the area around the Church and that around the Mill.

## (d) Burnham Thorpe

The whole village of Burnham Thorpe.

## NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

*The South Northamptonshire District Council (Parish of Nether Heyford—Footpath KS2) Public Path Diversion Order, 1977.*

Notice is hereby given that on 21st March 1977, the South Northamptonshire District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert a length of public footpath at Manor Park in the Parish of Nether Heyford being part of footpath KS2 from a point on the north-eastern corner of Plot 1 at grid reference SP66225878 for a distance of 30 metres, in a south-westerly direction diagonally across Plot 1 to a point on the south-western corner of Plot 1, Manor Park, Nether Heyford, at grid reference SP66205876 to a line running from the said point at grid reference SP66225878 in a southerly and then south-westerly direction around the curtilage of Plot 1, Manor Park to the said point at grid reference SP66205876.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the South Northamptonshire District Council at the Town Hall, Towcester, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours from Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from 25th March 1977, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or any regulation made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of

the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 25th March 1977, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

*The County of Northumberland (Bridleway No. 9, Parish of Happle) Bridleway Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 14th March 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Northumberland County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the line of Bridleway No. 9 from a point approximately 500 metres from its junction with County Road C.181 at Bickerton in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1,207 metres, to its connection with Bridleway No. 3 at the parish boundary. The diversion will run from the same point approximately 500 metres from the junction with County Road C.181 at Bickerton in an easterly and then north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1,094 metres, to connect up with Bridleway No. 3 at the parish boundary.

A copy of the Order, and the map contained in it, has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Post Office, Front Street, Rothbury, during normal business hours until 25th April 1977. Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned at the address shown below before 25th April 1977, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Northumberland County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
