BISHOPS (RETIREMENT) MEASURE 1951

Notice is hereby given that on the 30th March 1977 Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, as Counsellors of State approved on Her Majesty's behalf an Order in Council under the above-named Measure, confirming a Declaration by the Archbishop of Canterbury that the Bishopric of Canterbury will become vacant on the 30th September 1977.

PASTORAL MEASURE 1968

Notice is hereby given that on the 30th day of March 1977 Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, as Counsellors of State, by Order in Council on Her Majesty's behalf confirmed the following Schemes made by the Church Commissioners for:

1. (1) Altering the areas of the parishes of Christ Church, Swindon and Saint John the Baptist, Park, Swindon, in the diocese of Bristol (2) altering the name of the benefice and parish of Saint John the Baptist, Park, Swindon, to "Saint John the Baptist and Saint Andrew, Swindon"; and (3) establishing a team ministry for the area of the benefice of Saint John the Baptist and Saint Andrew, Swindon.

2. Uniting the benefices of Scalford with Wycombe and Chadwell; and Goadby Marwood, in the diocese of Leicester.

3. Appropriating the redundant church of Saint Mark, Woodhill, in the diocese of Saint Albans, and part of the land annexed or belonging thereto to use as a Christian residential training centre and for purposes ancillary thereto, and empowering the said Commissioners to sell the building and land for such uses.

4. Declaring redundant the parish church of Saint Peter, Claydon, being one of the parish churches of the parish of Claydon and Barham, in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

5. (1) Providing for a new place of worship within the parish of Putney in the diocese of Southwark which will incorporate parts of the existing parish church of Saint Mary; (2) declaring redundant Saint Mary's Church, and providing for the demolition of part of the building and the appropriation and gift of the remainder and the site to use for the new place of worship; and (3) declaring redundant the chapel of ease of Saint John in the said parish and providing for the appropriation and lease of the building and site to use by the Polish Roman Catholic Church.

6. Appropriating the redundant church of Saint Mary, Tyneham, in the diocese of Salisbury, together with the land annexed or belonging thereto, as a rest and exhibition centre and for purposes ancillary thereto and empowering the Salisbury Diocesan Board of Finance to lease the said building and land for such uses.

7. Appropriating the redundant church of Holy Trinity, Bristol, in the diocese of Bristol, together with the land annexed or belonging thereto, to use as a community centre and for purposes ancillary thereto and empowering the said Commissioners to sell the said building and land for such uses.

8. Uniting the benefices of Harby and Stathern, in the diocese of Leicester.

9. Substituting the church of Saint Nicholas, Porton as the parish church of the parish of Idmiston with Porton and Gomeldon in the diocese of Salisbury and declaring redundant the existing parish church of All Saints, Idmiston.

10. Incorporating the extra-parochial place known as Croxteth Park into the parishes of The Good Shepherd, West Derby; and West Derby, and altering the areas of the said parishes and the parishes of Saint Mary, Knowsley and Saint Chad, Kirkby, in the diocese of Liverpool.
