Braintree District Council (Part of Footpath No. 109, Braintree) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 1st April 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Braintree District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way situated at Ordnance Survey Field No. 0005 Sheet Nos. TL7623 (1967 Revision) and TL7624 (1971 Edition) and running from the unadopted highway known as Mountbatten Road, Braintree, approximately 110 yards from the rear boundaries of Numbers 28-30 Connaught Gardens, Braintree, in a north-westerly direction towards the River Blackwater for approximately 190 yards thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 20 yards to a line running from the aforementioned point and continuing in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 34 yards, a north-westerly direction for approximately 56 yards, a north-easterly direction for approximately 30 yards and thence following the line of the footways and carriageway to be constructed in connection with the development of the site in a generally north-westerly direction for approximately 120 yards then in a north-easterly direction for approximately 30 yards where it rejoins the existing route of footpath No. 109.

Designation of Conservation Area—Thorpe St. Andrew
