Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders, made on 22nd March 1977, are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as unopposed Orders, by the Essex County Council.

The effect of the Order relating to Footpath 17 Thorpe-le-Soken will be to extinguish the public right of way commencing at a point A on the map contained in the Order, about 1,900 feet south-east of Landermere Hall, and running in a north-easterly direction for about 820 feet and thence in a north-westerly direction for about 900 feet to a point B. The effect of the Order relating to Footpath 19 Thorpe-le-Soken will be to extinguish the public right of way commencing at a point D on the map contained in the Order, about 2,500 feet north-west of Landermere Hall and running in a north-easterly and generally a northerly direction for about 1,500 feet to point E.

The Essex County Council are entering into a footpath creation agreement with the owners of the land which will create two public footpaths as replacements for the paths which it is proposed to extinguish under these Orders.

Copies of the Orders and the maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the Secretary and Legal Officer to the Tendring District Council, Weeley, Clacton-on-Sea, Essex, from 8th April 1977 to 6th May 1977.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Orders may be sent in writing to the undersigned before 6th May 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Essex County Council may instead of submitting the Orders to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Orders. If the Orders are submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Orders.

*The Kent County Council (F.P. 592 (part) Edenbridge)  
Public Path Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 24th March 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Kent County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of F.P. 592 Edenbridge from its junction with Troy Lane 210 feet north of Yew Tree Farm for 490 feet generally eastwards, to a new length of footpath of not less than 6 feet in width from a point on Troy Lane opposite Troy Town Cottages for 550 feet generally south-eastwards to join F.P. 592.
