The Thanet District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Thanet District Council proposes to make an Order under sections 31(1) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, to control the use of the parking places named in the Schedule to this notice, which shows the classes of vehicles, the days and times of operation, the maximum period for waiting and (where applicable) the scale of charges and the concessions for season ticket holders proposed for each parking place. The parking places are divided into three different categories in the Schedule, as follows:

Part I Free parking. Part II ••• ...

Standard charges.
"Short stay" (proportionately higher charges but cheaper for periods up to 2 hours). Part III

The draft Order includes exemptions from any time limits and from the payment of any charges for the following vehicles:

(a) invalid carriages;

vehicles issued to disabled persons by the Department of Health and Social Security in lieu of invalid carriages; and disabled persons' vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge issued under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, or a badge having effect under those Regulations as if it were a disabled person's badge.

The Order will specify the conditions under which the parking places may be used. Full details are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the location of the parking places, may be seen, during normal office hours, at: Council Offices, Cecil Street, Margate (Administrative Department); Albion House, Ramsgate, (Environmental Department).

Mr. K. C. Barnacle, of the Environmental Department, will be prepared to answer any questions about the proposed Order at Albion House during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 20th May 1977.
