The Trunk Road (Northern Avenue (Otherwise Known in Part as Ash Grove and in Part as Manor Way) Cardiff)
(Bus Stops) (Clearway) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, which shall come into operation on 13th June 1977.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit vehicles, other than buses, from waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day at any bus stop in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice where the carriageway at that stop is marked (a) as a bus stop, and (b) with a broad yellow line adjacent to the edge of the carriageway ("the authorised markings").

Although the Order includes every bus stop in the length of road specified in the said Schedule, it should be noted that the provisions of the Order which prohibit waiting only apply to those stops which the Secretary of State has marked with the authorised markings.

While the Order remains in force it will enable the Secretary of State at any time to lay or remove the authorised markings at or from any bus stop in the specified length of road or to adjust the position in that length of road of the authorised markings, as traffic conditions may require.

Other vehicle will be permitted to wait at the bus stop withwith authorised markings where necessary for:

- 1. the removal of an obstruction to traffic:
- the maintenance of the road and in exercise of statutory powers with permission of the local authority; and
- 3. reasons of emergency.

# FORESTRY COMMISSION

The Forestry Commissioners hereby give notice that they have made an Order under the Plant Health Act 1967 entitled The Importation of Wood and Bark (Prohibition) (Great Britain) Order 1977.

This Order revokes the Importation of Wood (Prohibition) Great Britain) Order 1974 and re-enacts its provisions with modifications imposing new conditions for the permitted landing of wood of the genera Castanea, Quercus and Picea and of the coniferous genera. These conditions differ according to the genus and the country or territory in which the wood is grown or from which it is imported. The provisions of this Order relating to isolated bark (defined in Article 2 (1)) are new.

The Order prohibits the importation into Great Britain of wood (as defined in Article 2 (1)) of the descriptions specified in the second column of Schedule 1 from the countries referred to in that column unless the relevant conditions laid down in the third column have been fulfilled, and of isolated bark of the descriptions specified in Schedule 2 for the countries rection of isolated bark of the descriptions specified in Schedule 2 from the countries mentioned in that Schedule (except isolated bark of trees of the genera Castanea, Quercus and Picea grown in Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands which is exported directly to Great Britain), unless the Forestry Commissioners or an inspector authorised for the purposes of the Order have or has granted a licence allowing the importation of the wood or isolated bark.

This Order provides that an inspector authorised by the Commissioners may examine and take samples of wood or isolated bark imported or about to be imported, and that wood or isolated bark landed in contravention of the Order shall be destroyed by the importer, unless it is immediately re-exported or disposed of under licence.

The Order also provides that any wood appearing to the Commissioners or an inspector not to have been free at the contract of landing from the party and disposed.

time of landing from the pests and diseases mentioned in the Schedule, or not to have conformed with any statement in an accompanying certificate, shall be destroyed or disposed of under licence,

In addition, the Order lays down penalties for its contravention, and provides for the furnishing of information regarding imported wood and islolated bark.

The Order will come into operation on 11th July 1977 and has been published as Statutory Instrument No. 901.

#### **POST OFFICE SCHEME P3/1977**

Note: The Scheme which follows this note is made under Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and amends the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971. The amending Scheme, which comes into operation on 13th June 1977, revises postal charges generally, and provides for a new fee for parcels posted under the "delivery free of charges" service.

(This note is not part of the Scheme)

# THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 14) SCHEME 1977

Made - - - - - - - - 23rd May1977
Coming into operation - - - - 13th June 1977

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

# Commencement, citation and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 13th day of June 1977, and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 14) Scheme 1977.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P8/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P3/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P5/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P9/1972), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P3/1973), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P7/1973), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 6A) Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme P3/1974), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1974 (Post Office Scheme P7/1974), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P3/1975), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P1/1975), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 11) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P16/1975), the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 12) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme P3/1976), and the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 13) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme P5/1976).
- (3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

#### Fees for customs clearance

2. In paragraph 9 of the Scheme, as subsequently amended, the amount "27p" shall be deleted and "40p" inserted in its place.

#### Cash on delivery parcels

- 3.—(1) In sub-paragraph (2)(a) of paragraph 20 of the Scheme, as subsequently amended, the amount "£1.00" shall be deleted and "£1.20" inserted in its place.
- (2) In sub-paragraph (3)(a) of paragraph 20 of The Scheme, as subsequently amended, the amount "20p" shall be deleted and "25p" inserted in its place.

#### Delivery free of charges

- 4.—(1) After sub-paragraph (1)(a) of paragraph 21 of the Scheme, the following new sub-paragraph (1)(b) shall be inserted:
  (b) The sender shall also pay to the Post Office at the time that any amount is paid in accordance with the undertaking under
  (a) or repaid by the Post Office under (e) of this sub-paragraph, a fee of 25p for each parcel posted."
- (2) Sub-paragraphs (1)(b), (1)(c) and (1)(d) shall become (1)(c), (1)(d) and (1)(e) respectively.

#### Insured parcels

5. In sub-paragraph (1)(e) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme, as subsequently amended, the amount "£500" shall be deleted and "£600" inserted in its place.

# Compensation

6. In proviso (c) to sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 23 of the Scheme, the amount "£500" shall be deleted and "£600" inserted in its place.

Advice of delivery (outgoing insured parcels only) and enquiries

- 7.—(1) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 25 pf the Scheme, as substituted by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 11) Scheme 1975, the amount "10p" shall be deleted and "12½p" inserted in its place.
- (2) In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 25 of the Scheme, as substituted by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1975, the amount "20p" shall be deleted and "25p" inserted in its place.

#### Parcels in bond

- 8. For sub-paragraph (5)(a) of paragraph 26 of the Scheme, as substituted by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1975, there shall be substituted the following:
  - "(a) Where a parcel or parcels are stored for a period not exceeding 28 days, the fee shall be £1.40 for each parcel, except where two or more parcels are posted simultaneously by a sender to the same addressee, when the fee shall be:

    (i) Where there are not more than 5 parcels:

£1.10 for each parcel.

(ii) Where there are more than 5 parcels but not more than 30:

£1.10 for each of the first 5 parcels and then 65p for each additional parcel.

(iii) Where there are more than 30 parcels:

For the first 30 parcels the fee for each as in (ii) and then 40p for each additional parcel."

#### Rates of postage on parcels

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

#### Commencement, citation, and interpretation

- 1.-(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 13th June 1977 and may be cited as the Post Office Inland Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1977.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Inland Post Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P8/1975) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Inland Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P13/1975), the Post Office Inland Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1975 (Post Office Scheme P15/1975) and the Post Office Inland Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme P1/1976).
- (3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if this Scheme were an Act of Parliament.
  - 2.—(1) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of Part I of the Scheme, after the definition of "the Act" there shall be inserted:—
    "Area rate parcel" means a parcel posted in and intended to be delivered within, a prescribed area.
- (2) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of Part I of the Scheme, after the definition of "the minimum registration fee" there shall be inserted:-

'national parcel" means a parcel which is not an area rate parcel.

- (3) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of Part I of the Scheme, the definitions of "local parcel" "local parcel delivery area" and "ordinary parcel" shall be deleted.
- (4) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 7 of Part II of the Scheme, line 2 after "different delivery office" there shall be inserted (not being a "Area rate parcel", or being an area rate parcel not redirected to an address within the prescribed area for that parcel).

# 3. Additional postage on late posted packets.

Paragraph 6 of Part II of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following shall be substituted:—

#### ADDITIONAL POSTAGE ON LATE POSTED PACKETS

-(1) In this paragraph the expression "late posted packet" means a postal packet of such description as may be 6.prescribed:

(a) which is posted at any time in any posting box which may be provided by the Post Office on a train; or(b) which is posted at any time in any posting box which may be provided by the Post Office for the purpose at a railway station in order that it may, if possible, be conveyed by a particular train departing from that station; or

(c) which is accepted as a registered postal packet or as a recorded delivery packet at a travelling post office, that is a Post Office sorting carriage attached to a train, at such times as the Post Office may prescribe; or

(d) which is accepted as a registered packet or as a recorded delivery packet, after the hours up to which such postal packets are ordinarily accepted at the Office or posting in order that they may if possible be forwarded by a particular despatch, but within such further time (if any) as the Post Office may from time to time appoint in relation to the Office.

(2) There shall be charged and paid in respect of a late posted packet which is posted as a registered postal packet or a recorded delivery packet additional postage of such amount not exceeding 10p as the Post Office may fix.

(3) Where a packet is posted in a posting box referred to in sub-paragraphs (1)(a) or (1)(b) and

(a) it appears to be intended to be posted as a registered postal packet or has such a label as is mentioned in paragraph 44(2) attached to it and the additional postage thereon has not been prepaid or sufficiently prepaid, the packet may be forwarded by the train referred to in those sub-paragraphs as may be appropriate in the particular cases and the amount payable by the addressee or the sender under paragraph 13 shall be the amount of the deficiency;

payable by the addressee or the sender under paragraph 13 shall be the amount of the deficiency;
(b) where no such intention appears or no such label is attached and the additional postage thereon has not been prepaid

or sufficiently prepaid the packet may be forwarded as if it had not been posted as a late posted packet.

#### 4. Prohibitions

#### 6. Recorded delivery service

In sub-paragraphs (2) and (3) of paragraph 43 of the Scheme, "8p" shall read "9p".

#### 7. Cash on delivery

In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 47 of the Scheme, "40p" shall read "50p" and in sub-paragraph (3) "£50" shall read "£100".
