The Thurrock Borough Council (Footpaths 32 & 34, Stanford-le-Hope) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on 24th May 1977 the Thurrock Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to:

- (a) divert the public right of way known as footpath 32 running from Branksome Avenue in a generally northerly direction across the railway to Stanford-le-Hope By-Pass and for a distance of approximately 370 metres north of the By-Pass. The new path will commence at the junction of Branksome Avenue and First Avenue and will extend in a generally westerly and northerly direction across the railway to the By-Pass and thence north-westwards for approximately 360 metres and north-eastwards for approximately 400 metres; and
- (b) divert the public right of way known as footpath 34 running from the junction of Branksome Avenue and First Avenue in a westerly and northerly direction across the railway to the Stanford-le-Hope By-Pass. The new path will commence on the western side of the By-Pass at its junction with the new route of footpath 32 and extend south-westwards for a distance of approximately 200 metres.

The Order becomes operative as from 22nd June 1977, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 3rd June 1977, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

The North Yorkshire County Council (Footpath No. 11 Marrick) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on 6th May 1977 the North Yorkshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way known as footpath No. 11 Marrick, commencing from point A (marked on the map) 148 yards south-east of Marrick School going north-westwards to Marrick across meadow land to point B located at Marrick School; the new path commencing at point A 148 yards south-east of Marrick School going northwards along a green lane 120 yards before going westwards along a lane 100 yards to point C at Marrick School.
