Leeds City Council (Gildersome Spur, Morley) Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 7th April 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Leeds City Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of the public footpath running

from Wakefield Road to Gelderd Road between the points marked "A" and "B" on the map accompanying the Order. Point "A" is situated approximately 210 yards from Wakefield Road and it is proposed that the footpath should be diverted in a westerly direction from this point for a distance of 52 yards approximately, then in a northerly direction for 87 yards approximately before returning in an easterly direction for 60 yards approximately to rejoin the existing footpath at point "B".

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Administration, Leeds City Council, Selectapost 2, Civic Hall, Leeds, LS1 2UR (quoting reference A5/VBL) not later than the 8th July 1977, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no objections or representations are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the Leeds City Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
