ORDER, 1973-74

Proposed Article 4 Direction

Notice is hereby given that the City Council has resolved to institute the following Direction under Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1973-74:

1. No part of any building within a Conservation Area shall be treated with any form of cement rendering or stone cladding including imitation stone work cladding without the prior consent of the Local Planning Authority;
2. All external brickwork of any building within a Conservation Area shall not be painted without the prior consent of the Local Planning Authority.

As from the date of this notice, before any work specified in (1) and (2) above is carried out on properties in the area noted in Schedule 1, the prior consent of the Local Planning Authority will be required.

The Direction shall relate to all premises within the Conservation Area designated by the City Council, as indicated in Schedule 1.

The Direction will remain in force for 6 months. It will then expire unless before the termination of the said 6 months the Secretary of State for the Environment has granted his approval to the Direction for its continued use. Plans defining the area to which this Direction relates may be inspected during normal office hours at the Environmental Services Department, Planning Division, 16th Floor, Unity House, off Broad Street, Hanley, Stoke-on-Trent.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The District of Uttlesford (Footpaths 19 (Part) and 20 (Part) Great Dunmow) Public Path Stopping-up Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 24th May 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of

State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the District Council of Uttlesford as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to stop-up that part of Public Footpath No. 19, Great Dunmow which commences at a point on the southern boundary of O.S. Field 3257, Great Dunmow and running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 110 metres to a point marked B on the map at its junction with footpath 20, Great Dunmow and then running in a north-westerly direction for a further distance of approximately 100 metres to a point marked C on the map to the east of the eastern boundary of O.S. 1848, and that part of Footpath 20, Great Dunmow commencing at a point marked B on the map at its junction with footpath 19, Great Dunmow and running in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 30 metres to a point marked D on the map to the north-west of O.S. 3734. The Order requires the creation of an alternative highway for use as a replacement for these lengths of footpaths along a new line commencing at a point on the southern boundary of O.S. Field 3257, Great Dunmow and running in a north-westerly direction along the eastern side of the private drive to the Buildings Farm, Great Dunmow and then along the western side of the pond at Buildings Farm, O.S. 3734, for a distance of approximately 120 metres to a point marked D on the map at its junction with footpath 20, Great Dunmow and thence in a north-westerly direction along the eastern boundaries of O.S. 0043 and O.S. 0058 for a distance of approximately 95 metres to a point marked E on the map and thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 20 metres to join with the existing Footpath 19, Great Dunmow at the point marked C on the map.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the District Council Offices, Debden Road, Saffron Walden, the Library, King Street, Saffron Walden and the Council Offices, High Street, Great Dunmow.

Any representations or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive Officer, Uttlesford District Council, Council Offices, Dedben Road, Saffron Walden, CB11 4AB, before 8th July 1977 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no objections or representations are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the Uttlesford District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
