HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Fishguard-Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (Llanarth Bridge Diversion) Order 1977
and

The Fishguard-Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (Llanarth Bridge Diversion Side Roads) Order 1977

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that in relation to the above mentioned Trunk Road at Llanarth in the County of Dyfed, he has made under the Highways Act 1959:

1. an Order under section 7 which provides:
 - (a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Llanarth in the County of Dyfed shall become a

trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation and

- (b) that the length of the Fishguard-Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Dyfed that the new trunk road described in (a) above is open for through traffic.

2. an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways.
- (b) to stop up a highway.
- (c) to make provision with regard to the rights of statutory undertakers and of sewerage authorities,

all at Llanarth aforesaid.

Copies of the Orders and of the relevant plans have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff and at the offices of Dyfed County Council, County Hall, Aberaeron, Dyfed and at the Post Office, Llanarth where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Orders and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of either of those Acts, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may within six weeks from 8th July 1977 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Orders or of any provision contained therein.
